Your Travel Essentials

How to Use Your Train E-Ticket

Your e-ticket is delivered electronically. Please print it out or keep it accessible on your mobile device. At the station, proceed to the designated counter or use automated machines to exchange your e-ticket for a physical boarding pass. Ensure you have your passport or valid ID ready for verification.

- Print your e-ticket or save to phone.
- Present ID and e-ticket at counter for boarding pass.
- Arrive at least 60 minutes before departure.



Cross-Border / International Trains

For international journeys between Laos and China, immigration and customs procedures will be conducted at the border stations (e.g., Boten/Mohan). Passengers must disembark with all luggage, clear immigration, and re-board the train. Verify visa requirements for your nationality well in advance.

- Prepare necessary visas for both countries.
- Disembark with all belongings at border.
- Follow official instructions for border crossing.



Luggage Guidelines

Each passenger is generally allowed one piece of hand luggage (max 20kg, dimensions 55x35x25cm) and one checked luggage. Excess luggage may incur fees or be refused. Ensure all valuable items and documents are in your hand luggage.

- Adhere to weight and size limits.
- Keep valuables in hand luggage.
- Label all your bags clearly.





Important Travel Information

Prohibited Items

For your safety and the safety of others, certain items are strictly prohibited on trains, including firearms, explosives, flammables, toxic substances, and illegal drugs. Violation can lead to serious legal consequences.

- No firearms, explosives, flammables.
- No toxic substances or illegal drugs.
- Declare any suspicious items to staff.



Restricted Items

Some items are restricted and require special conditions for transport. These include certain types of sharp objects (if not properly sheathed), large quantities of liquids, and specific electronic devices with high-capacity batteries. Always check with train operators if unsure.

- Sharp objects must be sheathed.
- Check limits for liquids and batteries.
- Inquire about specific items if uncertain.



Travel Tips

Always keep your valuables secure and be aware of your surroundings, especially in crowded areas. Carry a small first-aid kit, stay hydrated, and try local delicacies. Learn a few basic phrases in Lao and Mandarin – locals appreciate the effort!

- Secure valuables; stay vigilant.
- Stay hydrated, carry first-aid.
- Learn basic local phrases.
